requires professional removal

BUTTERFLY BUSH

remove it by the roots





HAWKWEED

remove it by the roots





hand pull it from the ground

LAMIUM

remove it by the roots



POLICEMAN'S HELMET

hand pull it from the ground



PURPLE LOOSESTRIFE

remove it by the roots



REED CANARY GRASS

keep trimmed to prevent seeding



SCOTCH BROOM

cut from base or remove by roots



SPURGE LAUREL

remove it by the roots, wear gloves



What are invasive plants?

- Invasive plants are non-native plants that out-compete native plants and spread quickly.
- They destroy food sources and take over important habitats.
- Some are even hazardous to human health.

How can you help?

- When planting choose native plants.
- Don't dump green waste—it is not giving back to nature. Dumping green waste in parks and greenbelts is illegal; it spreads invasive species, increases fire hazards and is costly to clean up.
