



Add sense of entrance to park

- New double entry path with garden bed and small flowering tree- signage will be worked into garden bed trash relocated to sit in planting
- New meeting spot bench
- New path
- Retain existing path & cut to meet new path
- See Section 1 (S1) to the left

Upper accessible conversation node

- New planting bed with small flowering tree to help with privacy and shade
- The sunny conversation area with extra space for wheel chairs or walking aids
- The shaded eye exercise area
- See Section 2 (S2) to the left

Mid-level seating and viewing areas

- Existing Paths
- Seating and viewing area
- Serpentine Staircase with senior friendly 6" steps and new metal handrail on both sides. Handrail may have a public art component incorporated into the design.
- New colourful planting with small flowering tree
- Mid stair rest-stop bench
- New Mid-level Viewing/Seating- this area will only be built if budget allows East side may have lounge chairs

Lower seating area

- Seating and viewing area
- Augmented paved pathway

Navy Jack Park Improvements

Concept design shows new stairs to the community gardens and Centennial Seawalk as well as new seating nodes. The planned stairs will be made of concrete and have a low consistent step of 6" (150mm) and handrails. The handrail may have a public art element incorporated into a section of them. The new stairs are intended to be safer, more comfortable and durable than the existing stairs.

A series of seating opportunities are presented as one moves from the street towards the Centennial Seawalk. These nodes offer various degrees of sun and shade, internal views as well as views beyond, social or quiet spots.

Halfway down the stairs is another seating or rest stop on one side of the path and a lounging opportunity on the other.

Plantings throughout the park will be renewed with the intention of providing some shaded seating and gardens with colourful plants with interesting textures while maintaining the views from the main spine of the park.
